Desotorow hosts “Spoked”: Savannah’s Bike Artisan Festival

SAVANNAH, Ga. -Desotorow Gallery, 2427 De Soto Avenue, hosts “Spoked”—a festival designed to promote the art of bicycles and the growing subculture of cycling. The festival will run from March 4-6.

The event kicks off on Thursday, March 4 with a screening of the film “Veer” at River Club at 9 p.m. The documentary follows five bicycle enthusiasts in the Pacific Northwest through their personal bike obsessions to the beginning of a two-wheeled culture. On Friday, March 5 from 6-9 p.m. is the opening reception for “Spoked,” a juried exhibition at Desotorow Gallery featuring works of art inspired by the world of bikes.

The festival ends on Saturday, March 6 with the Artisan and Trade Show from 12-6 p.m. Booths are \$25 and people interested can register before March 4. Participants can submit to the following contests for \$2: best commuter bike, best miscellaneous build bike, foot-down, track stand, and more. Prizes from Urban Velo, One Fixed, Star Bike and Absolutely Kosher Records will be awarded to contest winners.
